Hops for Humanity Charity Event

On July 15th, Jeff Landers and Kevin "Woj" Wojdak represented UKG and attended the **Hops for Humanity**Charity Event at Diplomat West Banquet Hall,

Elmhurst. The event was sponsored by Chicagoland

Winemakers Homebrew Shop, Elmhurst.



We served 5 gallons of Vienna Lager from the April 13th UKG / Club Wort Brew-In at Jeff Landers' house. This beer also served as our Homebrew club competition entry for the night as a sub-event of the evening involved a People's Choice award for the best three brews served. There were 6 local clubs, Chicagoland Winemakers, and an individual member of the Hops for Humanity association represented.

The Hops for Humanity mission statement is "Hops for Humanity is a group of dedicated local men and women who gather together four times a year to raise money for greater Chicagoland charities while drinking unique craft beer from local breweries. Hops for Humanity is a 501(c)(3) charity recognized by the IRS, and is a simple and fun way to raise money."

Attendees to the event each paid \$100 to attend the event and the proceeds from the event went to a local charity chosen that night.

We, the brewers, were each stationed at a table and provided samples to the guests in a format similar to any beer festival. Tickets were presented for each pour and we discussed the beers with the guests.

Each of the three charities presented to the group to talk about what they do and are all about and why they need the money and how it will be used. Then, the homebrewers each came up to the stage and talked about their Homebrew club and brew for the evening.



There were several interesting brews from the various clubs from our Vienna Lager to a Mexican lager to a Lemon Milkshake IPA (made with lemon forward hops and Lemon grass). Some of the other beers included a straight up IPA, a Red Rye Pale ale, a barrel-aged chocolate stout and an American Porter.

There were three charities represented:

- A medical service that needed money to help pickup people for appointments.
- Elmhurst Symphony Needed extra money to pay the musicians and support the group.
- Kartwheels 4 Kids A group of girls who collect money every year to give away to a charity of their choosing.

After the presentation, the guests voted for their favorite charity and the Kartwheels 4 Kids group won. All of the proceeds collected for the event that night went to this charity.

The guests also voted for their favorite beers of the night:

1st Place - Mexican Lager (Oak Park Brew Club)

2nd Place - Red Rye Pale Ale (CHAOS)

3rd Place - IPA from a Hops for Humanity member

All brewers were given medals.

Brewery Reviews



Waterline Brewing, Wilmington NC by Darrell Proksa

On the banks of the Cape Fear river, in the shadow of the main bridge into Wilmington NC, is **Waterline Brewing**. The brewery shares a timber-frame and concrete block warehouse type building from the 1940s with an art gallery; not sure which was there first. The area around the building is mostly vacant so there's plenty of parking and room for food trucks.

Given there aren't any trees on the property, sitting in the "beer garden" mid day in the summer is a challenge except for the two canopies shading a few picnic tables. Fortunately, the tap room space which was carved out from the cavernous warehouse is air conditioned. Since the brewery's neighbor is an art



gallery, there's plenty of artwork for sale decorating the tap room.

There's ample seating at the concrete-topped bar with a few tables and a couch lined nook.

All the beers I tried were solid. They brew 6 year-round beers of which the

Kolsch and Red are the most popular. Of course there are IPAs as well plus an occasional Belgian and high gravity beer in the lineup.
