Brewery Review

Goodwood Brewing and Spirits

In July, I took the drive down to Indianapolis to help judge at the Indiana Brewer's Cup competition as part of the Indianapolis State Fair. I have entered this competition several times over the years and never had any luck and no wins but I had heard the judging for the competition was fun and they offered judges who traveled over 100 miles to get there a stipend of \$100 to judge at least two sessions. (With gas prices in July, that money came in handy.) I also hoped by changing things up that I'd change my luck in the competition... I had 5 entries.

I took a half day off from work the Friday before and drove down to Indianapolis. It was supposed to be about a 4 hour drive. Unfortunately, I left around 2 p.m. and forgot about the time change and arrived around 7:30 p.m. their time with stops and such. I stayed at the Holiday Inn Crowne Plaza at Union Station downtown and, after checking in and grabbing a beer at the bar (Wee Mac Scottish Ale from Sun King), I looked for the closest Brewery to have dinner.



Luckily, just about a block and a half from the hotel was **Goodwood Brewing and Spirits**. I'd never heard of Goodwood but decided to give it a shot. (After looking it up for this review, I now see this brewery is part of a chain from Louisville, KY.)

Goodwood touts themselves as offering a traditional southern menu with favorites such as our Buffalo Cauliflower, Chicken and Waffles and Fried Green Tomatoes. They say you'll find beer-infused house made sauces, burgers too big for your mouth and a bar that features twenty-eight beer taps (and over thirty bourbons) in a lively, family-friendly atmosphere.

Among my dinner choices, I did try the Fried Green Tomatoes (pictured above) and they were quite good. I also had Pub Fish and Chips and KimChi Spicy Collard Greens. The fried green tomatoes are served with goat cheese and a charred scallion aioli. Yummmmmm...

I ordered a flight of 4 beer samples and the bartender took care of me keeping samples coming my way. By the end of dinner, I had 9 samples but was only charged for my original flight.



Here are the beers I tried and what I wrote about each one in Untappd Ratings are based on the Untappd 1-5 rating scale.:

- **Kentucky Common** A tasty beer, creamy, light, no roast notes coming through other than color. (Rated 3.75)
- Louisville Lager Super clean, lightly bready malty, light overall. (Rated 4.00)
- Rivergoat Maibock A tasty beer that leans more malty than hoppy.
 (Rated 3.75)
- Syla (Belgian Strong Golden Ale... A Ukrainian brewery recipe) -Interesting, phenolic, clean (Rated 3.75)
- Red, White, and Birthday Beer (Raspberry and Blueberry Wit)
 - Raspberry and Blueberry wit... there's a bit of a clash here with the fruit and the phenolics...comes off almost mouthwashy. (Rated 3.25)
- Walnut Brown Ale A very pleasant, easy drinking southern English Brown but not too sweet...balanced. (Rated 4.25)
- Nutty by Nature Bourbon Barrel Brown Ale Balanced bourbon barrel brown... you taste the bourbon but you also taste the beer... very tasty (Rated 4.25)
- Bourbon Barrel Stout Good stout but the bourbon barely peeks through...disappointing. The Nutty by Nature is much better for bourbon flavor. (Rated 3.50)

• Bourbon Barrel Dark Ale - Soda like, sweet, light, not getting much bourbon unless my palate is shot. (Rated 3.25)

Overall, I thought Goodwood Brewing was pretty solid from the food and beer standpoint. There were some very good beers and some mediocre beers but none that absolutely made me want to leave.

I'd definitely visit again if I were in the area.
