The Montmorency Cherry still mead was wonderful, and at 13% will carry well into the fall if they don't run out. Most of their meads are session meads at about 6%. These are served lightly carbonated and chilled. The black currant and Concord grape with vanilla was particularly enjoyable. Currently, the Meadery is only open on the weekend as Rico is the only employee and still works his 9-5, too. I hope they see enough business to be able to grow in staff and in hours!
